1. Define the following terms as used in client assessment (4 Marks)

2. Bipolar disorder is characterized by extreme mood swings that include emotional highs (mania or hypomania) and lows (depression). Identify and describe TWO common symptoms experienced during the manic phase of bipolar disorder. (4 Marks)
3. Observation is one assessment method that a counsellor will likely apply when conducting client assessment. State FOUR other methods of assessment (4 Marks)
4. In some cases, a counsellor may find it necessary to refer a client before sessions are over. Highlight FOUR reasons for client referral. (4 Marks)
5. The Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition (DSM-5), classifies mental disorders into various categories based on similar clinical characteristics and symptom presentations. State FOUR categories of mental disorders outlined in the DSM-5 (4 Marks)
6. According to Jean Piaget's theory of cognitive development, the sensorimotor stage is the first stage of cognitive development that occurs from birth to around age 2. Describe FOUR major characteristics and developmental changes in the sensorimotor stage. (4 Marks)
7. Various theoretical approaches and models can guide the assessment process, offering unique perspectives on human behaviour and psychological functioning. Outline FOUR types of theoretical applications in client assessment (4 Marks)
8. A depressed client may experience a loss of interest in their daily activities. Identify other FOUR clinical features of depression. (4 Marks)
