Section A: Answer ALL Questions (20 marks).

- a) There is a general agreement that we have all been introduced to ethics in a number of ways, even before taking any formal course in ethics. Giving practical examples in each case, explain in details how you were introduced to ethics through:
- i. Parents (family)(2 marks)
 - ii. Learning institutions(2 marks)
 - iii. Religious institutions (Church etc.) (2 mark)
 - iv. Sociatal values. (2 marks).
 - v. Your own experience (2marks).
- b) The most powerful argument against abortion is the biblical evidence for the personhood of an unborn child as a unique person. Analyze the following scriptures in support of this view. (10 marks).
- i. Luke 1: 39-44
 - ii. Psalm 51: 1-5
 - iii. Psalm 139:13-16
 - iv. Genesis 25:22-25
 - v. Exodus 21:22-25.

- c) A friend who graduated recently has been admitted to pursue a Master's programme in a university in the United States of America. Giving practical examples, explain to her the characteristics of Christian ethics that should help her remain focused in her faith while pursuing her education in a different culture and conflicting views (10 marks).
- d) Wilful sin in a Christian life results in harmful consequences. With support of scriptures and giving practical examples, discuss five harmful consequences of wilful sin(10 marks)
- e) With support of biblical evidence, discuss the dimensions that need to be considered in every human action when making an ethical decisions (10 marks)
- f) Four objections are regularly raised against the biblical view that homosexuality is wrong. Discuss these objections and provide biblical response to them (10 marks)
