- a) Identify the three ways that the book of Acts can be outlined/structured. (3 Marks)
- b) Describe the meaning of “baptized in the Holy Spirit” (4 Marks)
- c) Name, explain and apply the 4 characteristics of the new prophetic community found in Acts 2:42-47 (8 Marks)
- d) Paul’s second missionary trip takes him to Philippi (16:6-40) where a small church is planted. The chapter shows a great social-economic and cultural diversity of the first members of the church. Discuss briefly (5 Marks)

SECTION B: Answer ANY TWO questions

- 1. Acts 1:8 is often characterized as the thumbnail outline for Acts. With textual examples, discuss how this outline plays out in the whole of the book of Acts (10 Marks)
- 2. The preaching of the early church was highly christological (about the person and work of Jesus) as can be gathered from the sermons of Peter, Philip, Stephen and Paul. With textual examples discuss (10mks)
- 3. In the book of Acts, Luke doesn’t paint a picture of a perfect church that has no struggles and conflicts. Name and explain
 - a) 3 incidences that show great progress, organization and the triumphant nature of the church (6 Marks) and
 - b) 2 incidences that show its weaknesses as a human organization (4 Marks)
- 4. Paul is a transformational leader who after conversion and commission founds many new churches in the Mediterranean world. Explain 5 aspects of transformational leadership that emerge from his work and ministry (10 Marks)
