SECTION A: Answer ALL questions

1. Paul's letters were a surrogate of his own physical apostolic ministry that address occasional and tangible issues within the faith communities:
 - a) Briefly explain 3 key reasons that led Paul to write Romans. (6 Marks)
 - b) Using a three-level-structure of Galatians (chapters 1-2, 3-4 & 5-6) summarise the message of Galatians. (6 Marks)
 - c) "The works of the law" and "the righteousness of God" are two key terms in both Romans and Galatians. Explain their meaning and significance in the Christian life. (8 Marks)

SECTION B: Answer ANY TWO questions

2. By use of Romans 6 explain why believers in Christ should not continue in sin once they trust in Christ. (10 Marks)

3. Other than the righteousness or justification there are other key themes that emerge from Galatians and Romans. Using textual examples, explain and apply five of these from the two letters (10 marks)
4. In both Romans and Galatians Paul is categorical that Gods people in the present cannot live under the law as a guide to life anymore but must discern the will of God by the Holy Spirit. Discuss (10 Marks)
5. *“If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.”* (Gal. 5:25). Discuss the meaning of this verse in the light of Gal. 5:25-6:5) and apply its significance to the Christian life. (10 Marks)
