 - (a) Wives (3 marks)
 - (b) Husbands (3 marks)
 - (c) Children (3 marks)
 - (d) Slaves (3 marks)
 - (e) Masters (3 marks)

2. Several theories have been proposed concerning morally good actions. Giving contemporary examples, explain the following theories and the criticisms leveled against each of them.
 - (a) Morals are mores (5marks)
 - (b) Right is what brings pleasure (5 marks)
 - (c) The human race is the basis of right (5marks)

Section B: Answer ANY TWO Questions. (15 marks each)

3. You have been invited to speak at a couple's premarital counselling seminar. With biblical evidence identify and explain the following:
 - (a) FOUR principles of marriage ethics that you will discuss with them. (8marks)
 - (b) FIVE responsibilities of a husband and TWO responsibilities of a wife. (7 marks)

4. Ethical themes in Old Testament formed the basis of an ethical life for the Israelites. Briefly discuss the significance of the following in influencing Israelite ethical life:
 - (a) Covenants (10 marks).
 - (b) The words of God (3 marks).
 - (c) God's goodness (2 marks)

With practical examples explain FIVE ways in which children and young people are introduced to Christian ethics. (15 marks)
