- a) Your church has asked you to preach a sermon series on Acts. Highlight three different ways that you can organise and structure the book in order to maximise its message (6 Marks)
- b) Luke had two main purposes for writing Acts. Explain (6 marks)
- c) Discuss the 4 main characteristics of the early Christian movement in Acts 2:41-47 and how it applies in our contemporary world (8 Marks)

SECTION B: Answer ANY TWO questions

- 1. Acts 1:8 forms the basic outline, structure and progress of Acts. With examples, discuss how this outline plays out in the whole story from Jerusalem to Rome (10 Marks)
- 2. Peter and Paul's sermons in Acts are highly christological. Discuss 5 key themes about Christ's person and work that emerge from their speeches and apply them to our present church life (10 Marks)
- 3. In Acts chapter 6 we are introduced to a divided church – between the Hellenists and the Hebraist women. Discuss 5 key contextual lessons that the church can learn from the apostolic wisdom. (10 Marks)
- 4. Discuss with contextual examples the model of the church that Acts 16 presents for us today. (10 Marks)
